1. APPLICATION OF TARIFF

This tariff contains the regulations and charges applicable to the provision of International common carrier services furnished by Iowa Network Services, Inc., (hereinafter referred to as the "Telephone Company" and/or "INS") between locations in the contiguous United States and international locations, as specified herein.

INS also operates an agent program with several carriers where INS refers to itself in each of these service areas by a unique name. For example, in the Hawkeye area, INS uses its d/b/a Hawkeye Telephone Company for Message Toll Service.

2. DEFINITIONS

Authorization Code: A numeric code which identifies the customer to be billed for calls charged.

Contiguous United States: The area within the boundaries of the District of Columbia and the 48 contiguous states as well as the offshore areas outside the boundaries of the coastal states of the 48 contiguous states, Alaska, Hawaii, Puerto Rico and U.S. Virgin Islands (including the artificial islands, anchored vessels, and fixed structures erected in such offshore areas for the purpose of exploring for, developing, removing and transporting resources therefrom) to the extent that such areas appertain to and are subject to the jurisdiction and control of the United States within the meaning of the Outer Continental Shelf Land Act, 43 U.S.C. Section 1331, et seq.

Customer: The person, company, firm, corporation, or other entity which orders or uses service and is responsible for the payment of charges and compliance with tariff regulations.

Feature Group D: The switched access service provided by a local exchange company as trunk side switching through the use of end office or access tandem switch equipment. Where no access code is required, the number dialed by the customer shall be a seven or ten digit number for calls in the North American Numbering Plan (NANP). For international calls outside the NANP, a seven to twelve digit number may be dialed. The form of the numbers dialed by the customer is NXX-XXXX, 0 or 1 + NXX-XXXX, NPA + NXX-XXXX, 0 or 1 + NPA + NXX-XXXX, and, when the end office is equipped for the International Direct Distance Dialing (IDDD), 01 + CC + NN or 011 + CC + NN. Feature Group D is also known as equal access.

Local Exchange Area: The general area in which a local exchange company provides exchange telephone service and within which a customer may make telephone calls without incurring toll charges.

2. DEFINITIONS (CONTINUED)

Other Common Carrier: A company other than INS providing interstate telecommunications services between local exchange areas.

North American Numbering Plan: This plan includes the following countries: United States and Canada

Service Authorization Form: The form used by applicants to request service from the Telephone Company. The form is merely a request for service and does not itself bind the Telephone Company to provide service.

Terminal Equipment: Devices, apparatuses and their associated wiring, such as teleprinters, telephone handsets or data sets.

3. GENERAL REGULATIONS

3.1 Undertaking of INS

International Telecommunications Services are furnished in accordance with the conditions and regulations, which are set forth in the body of this tariff.

3.2 Limitations

Service is offered subject to the availability of the necessary facilities and/or equipment and subject to the provisions of this tariff.

3.3 Use of Service

The service provided under this tariff shall not be used for any unlawful purpose.

3. GENERAL REGULATIONS (CONTINUED)

3.4 Payment and Billing

The following payment and billing regulations are applicable.

- a. Service is provided and billed on a monthly (30 day) basis, beginning on the date that service becomes effective. IDDD service becomes effective the day following written or verbal notice of its availability to the customer. Bills are due and payable when rendered. Interest at the rate of 1-1/2% per month or the highest rate allowed by law will accrue upon any unpaid amount commencing thirty (30) days after the mailing of the bill.
- b. The customer is responsible for payment of all charges for services furnished to the customer.
- c. INS reserves the right to examine the credit record of all applicants and customers. A customer whose service has been discontinued for non-payment of bills will be required to pay any unpaid balance due to INS before service is restored. In addition, INS will require a security deposit for the discontinued customer wishing to reestablish service equal to three (3) times the amount of the customer's highest monthly bill. If the customer's estimated traffic has increased since the account was cancelled, INS will require a security deposit equal to three (3) times the newly estimated minutes.
- d. Applicants or customers whose financial condition is not acceptable to INS will be required to make a security deposit. The amount of the deposit shall be calculated by multiplying the number of the customer's estimated monthly minutes of usage times \$1.75 times three (3) months. The customer shall be apprised that after 90 days of service that account will again be reviewed, and in the event all amounts due have been paid within the terms of the service authorization, the deposit will be refunded in full, plus interest at (one) 1.0%, calculated from the date that the customer makes the deposit.

3.4 Payment and Billing (CONTINUED)

- e. The name(s) of the customer(s) must be set forth in the application for service.
- f. In the case of a billing dispute between the customer and INS for service furnished to the customer which cannot be settled to mutual satisfaction, the customer can take the following action:
 - i. The customer may request, and INS will comply with the request, an in-depth review of the disputed amount. The undisputed portion and subsequent bills must be paid on a timely basis or the service may be disconnected.
 - ii. If notice of a dispute as to charges is not received in writing by INS within thirty (30) days after a bill has been mailed, the billing will be considered correct and binding. Provision of such notice does not affect the customer's obligations under Sections 3.4.a. and 3.4.f.i. preceding to make all payments within thirty (30) days after the bill has been mailed.
 - iii. If a billing dispute is resolved in favor of the customer, and the customer pays the total billed amount and disputes all or part of the amount, INS will refund to the customer the disputed amount plus interest at the rate of one (1%). If the customer withholds all or part of the billed amount and the dispute is resolved in favor of INS, the customer shall pay to INS the amount withheld pending settlement of the dispute plus interest at the rate set forth in Section 3.4.a. preceding.

3.4 Payment and Billing (CONTINUED)

g. Universal Service Charge

i. In addition to all other rates in this tariff, customers will be assessed an undiscounted Universal Service Fund ("USF") contribution factor. This USF contribution factor has been directed by the Federal Communications Commission ("FCC") and may be changed by the FCC quarterly. The USF factor replaces the Carrier Universal Service Charge ("CUSC"). From 04/01/03 to 06/30/03 the USF factor was 9.1%. From 07/01/03 to 09/30/03 the USF factor was 9.5%. From 10/01/03 to 12/31/03, the USF factor was 9.2%. From 01/01/04 to 6/30/04, the USF Factor was 8.7%. From 07/01/04 to 12/31/04 the USF Factor was 8.9%. From 01/01/05 to 03/30/05 the USF Factor was 10.7%. From 04/01/05 to 06/30/05 the USF factor was 11.1%. From 07/01/05 to 03/31/06 the USF factor was 10.2%. 3.5 Cancellation of Service by Customers

The customer may cancel service by giving a verbal notice to INS up to the day cancellation is requested.

3.6 Cancellation of Service by INS

- a. INS reserves the right to discontinue furnishing service, upon written notice, when necessitated by conditions beyond its control, or when the customer is using the service in violation of the provisions of this tariff.
- b. Without incurring liability, INS may immediately discontinue service or cancel an application for service by written notice to the customer (i) for nonpayment of any sum due to INS for more than 30 days after INS mails the bill for the amount due, (ii) for any violation of any regulation governing service under this tariff, (iii) by reason of any order or decision of a court or other government authority having jurisdiction which prohibits INS from furnishing such service.

3.7 Inspection, Testing and Adjustment

- a. Upon written request, INS will furnish the customer with the technical parameters that satisfy the requirements of this tariff. INS may interrupt the service at any time, without penalty to itself, because of departure from any of these requirements.
- b. Upon reasonable notice, the facilities provided by INS shall be made available to INS for such tests and adjustments as may be necessary for their maintenance in a condition satisfactory to INS.

3.8 Liability

- a. The Telephone Company is not liable for any act or omission of any other company or companies furnishing a portion of the service.
- b. INS' liability for willful misconduct, if established as a result of judicial or administrative proceedings, is not limited by this tariff. With respect to any other claim or suit, by a customer, subscribers to or users of any services provided to or resold by the customer or by any others, for damages associated with the ordering (including the reservation of any specific number for use with a service), installation (including delays thereof), provision, termination, maintenance, repair, interruption, or restoration of any service or facilities offered under this tariff, INS' liability, if any, shall not exceed an amount equal to the proportionate monthly recurring charges for the period during which the service was affected.

INS shall be indemnified and held harmless by the customer, subscribers to or users of any services provided to or resold by the customer, against:

- (1) Claims for libel, slander, infringement of copyright or unauthorized use of any trademark, trade name or service mark arising out of the material, data, information, or other content transmitted over INS' facilities; and
- (2) Claims for patent infringement arising from combining or connecting INS' facilities with apparatus and systems of the customer; and
- (3) All other claims arising out of any act or omission of the customer in connection with any service provided by INS; and
- (4) Any claim, loss or damage arising from the use of services offered under this tariff including but not limited to claims by subscribers to or users of services provided to the customer, and users of any services provided by or resold by the customer.

INS shall not be liable for and the Customer indemnifies and holds INS harmless from any and all loss, claims, demands, suits, or other action, or any liability whatsoever, whether suffered, made, instituted, or asserted by the customer or by any other party or persons, for any personal injury to, or death of, any person or persons, and for any loss, damage, defacement or destruction of the premises of the customer or any other property, whether owned by the customer or others, caused or claimed to have been caused directly or indirectly by the installation, operation, failure to operate, maintenance, removal, presence, condition, location or use of equipment or wiring provided by INS where such installation, operation, failure to operate, maintenance, condition, location or use is not the direct result of INS' negligence. 3.9 Interconnection

- a. Service furnished by the Telephone Company may be interconnected with services or facilities of other common carriers and with private systems, subject to the technical limitations established by the Telephone Company. Service furnished by the Telephone Company is not part of a joint undertaking with such other common carriers. Any special interface equipment or facilities necessary to achieve compatibility between the facilities of the Telephone Company and other common carriers shall be provided at the customer's expense.

- b. Interconnection with the facilities or services of other common carriers shall be under the applicable terms and conditions of the other common carriers' tariffs. The customer is responsible for taking all necessary legal steps for interconnecting their customer-provided terminal equipment or communications systems with such other common carrier's facilities. - b. INS offers customers presubscribed to INS the following International Direct Distance Dial Service (IDDD) dialing options.

4.4 Application of Rates and Charges

The customer's monthly charges for the Telephone Company's service are based upon the total time the customer uses the service, and the use of service options, if any. The rates are in effect twenty-four (24) hours a day and seven days a week. The per minute rate is the same for the initial minute and for all additional minutes.

4.4.1 Initial and Additional Periods

- a. Initial period rates are set forth in Section 4.5 following. The initial minute is the first minute or any fraction thereof after connection is made.
- b. The additional minute is each minute or any fraction thereof after the initial minute.
- c. The charge calculated for the initial minute plus additional minutes will determine the charge for the call. The total amount of the call is rounded up to the nearest whole cent.

4.4.2 Timing of Messages

a. Chargeable time is determined as follows:

b. Chargeable time begins when connection is established between the calling station and the desired telephone, private branch exchange, CENTRON or CENTREX system, or CENTRON or CENTREX station which is reached directly rather than through a private branch exchange, CENTRON or CENTREX attendant.

c. Chargeable time ends when the connection is terminated.

4.4.3 Determination of Time and Day

IDDD rates are in effect twenty-four (24) hours a day and seven days a week.

4.4.4 Rates Applicable on Certain Holidays

Special National Holiday rates are not applicable for International calls.

8. DIRECTORY ASSISTANCE SERVICE (CONTINUED)

8.3 Application of Rates and Charges

8.3.1 Allowance

A credit allowance will be given, i.e.; the charge that would otherwise apply will be waived, when:

a. The customer experiences poor transmission or is cut-off during the call to Directory Assistance, or

b. The customer has inadvertently misdialed and has reached Directory Assistance for the wrong area code.

To obtain such a credit/waiver, the customer must promptly notify his or her Customer Service Representative.

8.3.2 Travel Service

Directory Assistance requests placed by using INS/Long Distance Company's Travel Service will result in the application of the appropriate rate specified in Section 5.2 , Section 7.3.1 d. and Section 8.4.

9. PUBLIC PAYPHONE SURCHARGE9.1 Application

A Public Payphone Surcharge applies to all completed customer international long distance calls placed from a domestic public/semi-public payphone, which are not paid on a sent paid basis. Specifically, **the public payphone surcharge applies to:**

- (1) Travel Service;
- (2) calls to INS 8XX Service and
- (3) calls to International Directory Assistance Service

The Public Payphone Surcharge is applied in addition to any other applicable Service Charges or Surcharges.

The public payphone Surcharge does not apply to:

- Calls paid for by inserting coins at the public/semi-public payphone.
- Calls placed from stations other than public/semi-public payphones.
- Telecommunications Relay Service calls.

9.2 Rates

As billing capabilities become available, each completed call will be surcharged the following rate per call:
